Message from Andrew W. Hoffmann, Outgoing Board Chair, Montefiore

A SOURCE OF COMFORT & STRENGTH



In the last few weeks, I have experienced first-hand the amazing work of Montefiore's hospice services. Despite the circumstances, I was able to find a positive note in a tragic, too-soon ending to a life well-lived of a very close friend of mine.

He had reached the end stage of a powerful form of cancer. Faced with the most difficult decision when treatment options had vanished, our Director of Hospice Services, Diane Korman, met with him and his wife. Diane's counsel enabled him to intelligently choose its services.

As he received hospice care in his home for the last few weeks of his life, he remained alert and actively engaged. My good friend has never suffered fools gladly, and has always been a tough and demanding critic of service quality. And yet, he quickly came to deeply appreciate and rely on our hospice nurses. As I visited him frequently during those weeks, I could see that the hospice team allowed him and his family – his children, his wife, his mother and sister – to focus on each other, enabling them to share priceless and timeless intimate moments with one other. In short, to allow everyone the opportunity to express their love, and then, to say goodbye. A Montefiore hospice nurse was there when he passed away, and was a source of great comfort and strength to him and his family.

The hospice team attended to my friend, as they do to all patients and their families, with skilled care, compassion and grace. I have always known this to be true, but I now know, in the most direct and personal way, how our community is so fortunate to have Montefiore Hospice available at the most compelling time of need.

Looking to the immediate future, we hope and expect to be able to build

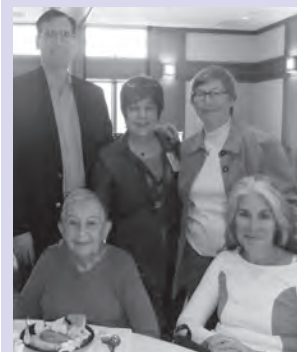

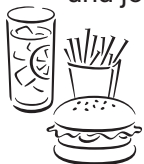


A Posh Dining Experience

**MESSAGE FROM
RABBI JOEL CHAZIN**

DOCTOR OF COMPASSION



A physician who refuses to give up on his patients, even when things seem futile; a psychiatrist who makes his life's pursuit in treating even the last stage of his aging patients a remarkable and humble young doctor and psychiatrist – Dr. Marc Agronin. Dr. Agronin is the Director of Mental Health and Clinical Research at Miami Jewish Health Systems and among others, has the responsibility of running the largest nursing home in Florida. But what is outstanding about him are his humility and his compassion.

He had agreed to an appointment with an 84-year old survivor of Auschwitz, who had been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease and was deteriorating rapidly. When the patient arrived with one of his sons, he shuffled with a clumsy gait as if his shoes were magnetically stuck to the floor and could barely speak but a few words of English, Hebrew and Yiddish. The primary doctor had refused to authorize a brain scan because it would not alter the diagnosis of Alzheimer's. Perplexed by the number of symptoms and convinced that a brain scan was necessary, Agronin forcefully persuaded the insurance company to give way and pay for the procedure.

What happened next is startling. In fact, the patient did not have Alzheimer's at all; rather, he had a huge cyst pressing on the part of the brain affecting both his speech and the movement of his feet.

Surgery drained the cyst – which proved to be benign – and removed the mass pressing on the brain. Three weeks later, the patient – named “Aron” – strode confidently into Dr. Agronin's office with a steady gait and vastly improved speech. He thanked the doctor profusely, declaring “you saved my life!” But the doctor was the one who was grateful and could bear witness to a near miracle and to the truth of a line from the Psalms: “They shall be fruitful even in old age, vigorous and fresh.”

Dr. Agronin's new book: “How We Age: A Doctor's Journey into the Heart of Growing Old” points the way for all of us in helping our elders...and never giving up hope.

Montefiore Receives Grant from the Cleveland Foundation to Improve Quality of Life and Health Outcomes for Aging Seniors Living with Chronic Diseases

Montefiore, a leader in senior healthcare, is the proud recipient of a \$100,000 grant from the Cleveland Foundation for an integrated approach to chronic disease management for improving the quality of life and health outcomes for the aging senior population in northeast Ohio.

Adrienne Shimek, OTR/L, MBA, Montefiore's Director of Rehabilitation, was honored recently by Crain's Cleveland Business, as one of their 2011 Health Care Heroes of the Year Award winners at a special luncheon.

Ms. Shimek was celebrated as one of the best of Northeast Ohio's world-class medical and wellness community leaders in the allied health category.

Ms. Shimek has created new service lines at Montefiore, including an outpatient wheelchair clinic and a sleep apnea program. The wheelchair clinic, launched in partnership with Health Aid of Ohio, assists clients with new wheelchairs, cushions and other upgrades that increase their ability to remain mobile and participate in the community. The service is also offered to patients at home who cannot make it to the

clinic for services.

The sleep apnea lab provides services for patients at home rather than at a testing lab, which enables patients to receive the respiratory equipment and other measures that ensure quality sleep, ultimately decreasing the risk and incidence of other health issues from congestive heart failure to diabetes.

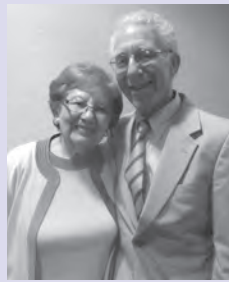
